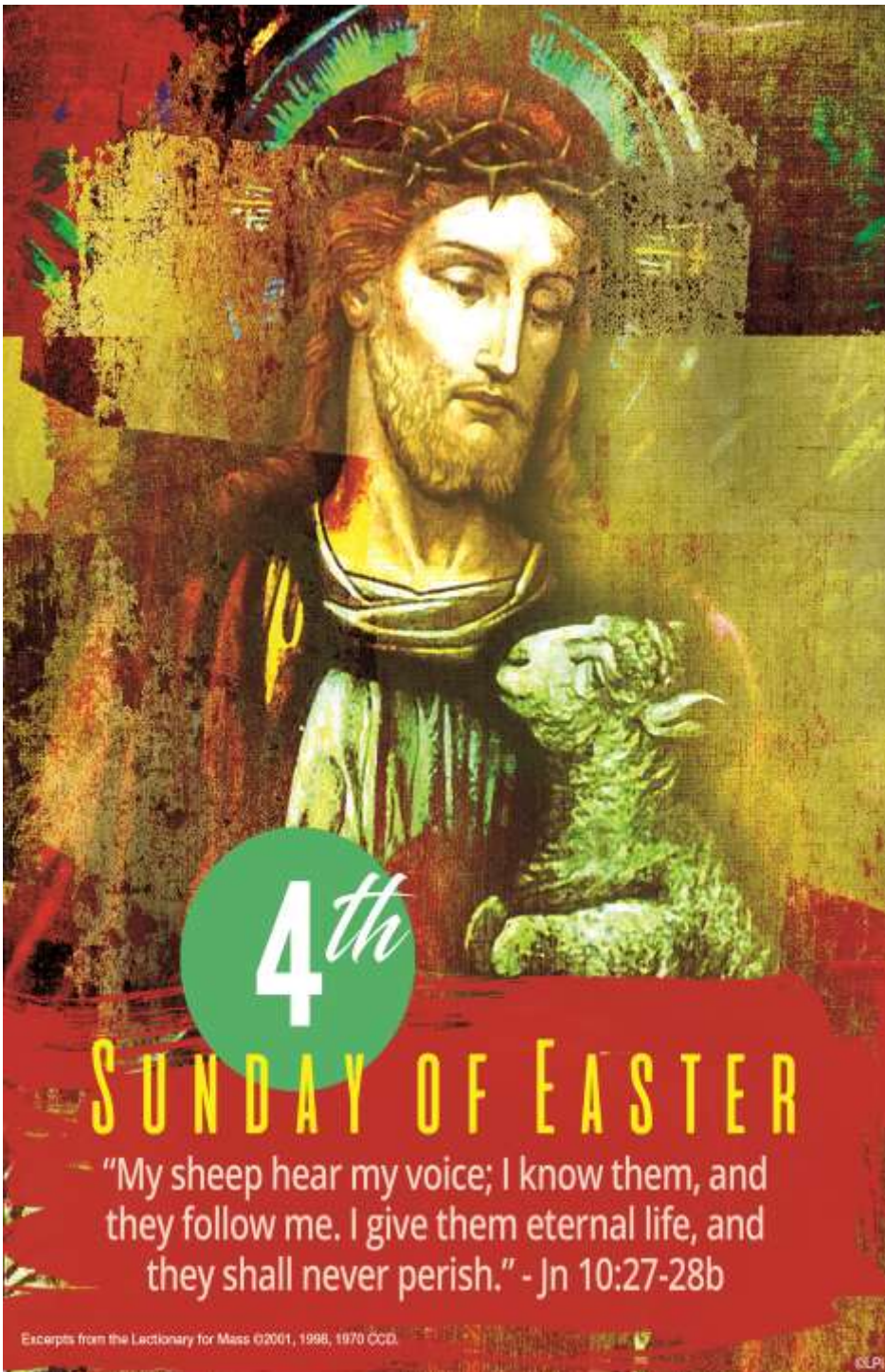

will be celebrated on  
**Wednesday, May 15**  
**at 6:30 PM (Chapel).**

**Taize** (pronounced-- *Teh-ZAY*) is an ecumenical, peaceful way to pray, using easy to learn musical chants, silent meditation, and scripture readings... a meditative, common prayer. Gathered in faith, Christians come together to sing uncomplicated repetitive short songs, like breath prayers, uncluttered by too many words, allowing the mystery of God to become tangible through the beauty of the Spirit in its simplicity. A few words sung over and over again (mantra) reinforce the meditative quality of prayer. They express a basic reality of faith that can quickly be grasped by the intellect, and will gradually penetrate the whole being.

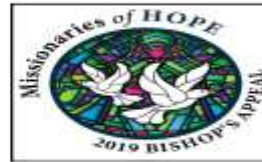
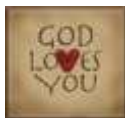


**The pantry helps 60 - 70 families who are able to utilize the pantry once a month. Over the past four weeks 259 items have been donated!**
